NWTF Women in the Outdoors

I'm writing this article to encourage women to attend Women in the Outdoors . I could make this argument on general principles, since the men would love having the women in their life share their hobbies. What guy wouldn't love it if his wife said, "go ahead and buy a better rifle honey, this one isn't good enough." ? Now that I have attended Women in the Outdoors, I must say it was fun and fascinating.

The purpose of WitO is to get women to enjoy outdoor activities, and they work hard at it. You chose 4 of the courses they offered out of photography, wilderness survival, two cooking courses, fly fishing, shotgun, archery, air pistol, self defense, and more. When we arrived, we were given a tasty breakfast, welcomed, and given our instructions. Then it was off to classes.

My first class was given by Marty Tatoian, a wildlife biologist and DEC. officer, on wilderness survival. He crammed an amazing amount of information in a very short time. I learned 5 or 6 ways to find my way if I'm lost, how to get water, how to build a fire without matches, and maybe most important, what to take with me. We learned a tiny bit about orienteering, enough that if it is offered next year as a course, everyone in my group would take it.

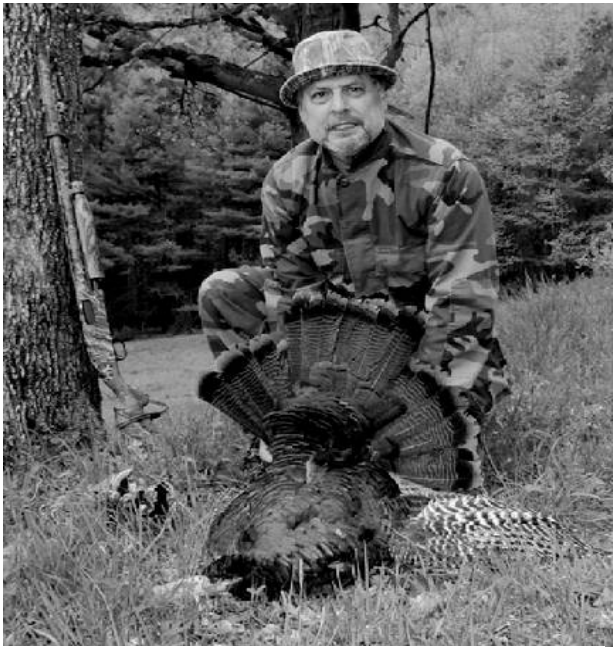
The next class was wild game cooking. Mike Cummings of the West Falls Conservation club taught that. We tried roast beaver, beaver burgers and venison burgers cooked with sausage seasoning. Some of the hints were: to get all the silver skin off, either before or after you cook it. Soak the meat in a brine of salt water and baking soda first. For small game like beaver and woodchuck, parboil it, before cooking as usual. He didn't get fancy in the preparation, just salt, pepper, garlic, olive oil and seasonings. The proof was in the eating. Everything was great.

That was right before lunch! They make a point of feeding the women well, as part of the enjoyment of the day.

After lunch it was off to Archery. They had several of the Mathew's Genesis bows there for the women to learn on. There were two crossbows for the women to try, and you could bring your own bow as well. For me it was an opportunity to improve my skills. The other women in my group had varying levels of skill, from novice to a former captain of her archery team. The crossbow was a novelty for all of us.

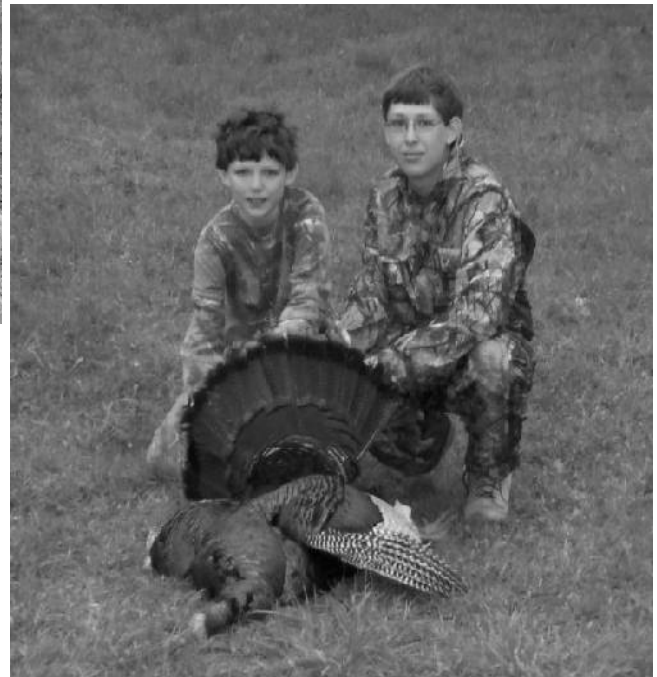


The last class for me was self defense, with Steve Townsend. The instructor did an excellent job of distilling a deep subject down to something digestible in a short class. He gave very practical advice for women, and then had us do hands on exercises.
